



What we are

Helsinki Photo Festival is a visual arts event focused on photography. The event is held annually and brings a new art experience to the Greater Helsinki area. In a period of 12 weeks curated photography exhibitions can be discovered 24/7 in public spaces and at art institutions and former industrial areas. Most exhibitions are accessible free of charge.

Every year the festival selects +50 open call winners from different genres. The contest is judged by a jury of leading experts in photography and education. The program includes numerous exhibitions, pop-ups and pedagogical events inviting photo enthusiasts of all ages from any gender, race or class.

Spectators can visit safely all exhibitions provided keeping safe distance and follow government recommendations and advice.

In these times when all our life is changing in unexpected ways what does fearless mean? Can being fearless improve your life or will it ruin it?




Ebeneser Foundation -The Kindergarten Museum 7.7.-30.9.2021

For the first time, the Helsinki Swimming Stadium -Uimastadion will host a photo exhibition.


Temporary photo displays will be set up in the swimming stadium to showcase the works of international award-winning visual artists.


Hanaholmen x Nordic Village 7.7.-30.9.2021

Vantaa Art Museum Artsi 1.8.-30.9.2021



Ebeneser Foundation x Helphoto bilingual online photography courses for children 3.9.2021

The Ebeneser Foundation is developing in collaboration with Helsinki Photo Festival a bilingual online learning activity pilot to inspire and stimulate children and beginners to kickstart photography skills (to be used with ipad & tablets).


For the photography courses, printed and digital material educational material will be created. We want to give a free tool to teachers, other professionals, parents and children how to learn more about photography and arouse interest in visual art in children (age 5-6), in primary school (age 7-15) and all other stakeholders to benefit from, for example, making better pictures, compositions, through an online photography course.

Ebeneser Foundation will administer the educational course to all ECEC centres in the Greater Helsinki area. The bilingual course will be made available in Finnish and Swedish. The lengths per online course will be max 5-7 minutes.
